- **Most 3 years' duration (4 years in Scotland)**
- **Options for 4 years' duration**
- **5 – 6 years' duration (Clinical courses)**

Postgraduate courses

- **1 to 2 years' duration (MA/MSc/MPhil)**
- **3+ years' duration (PhD)**

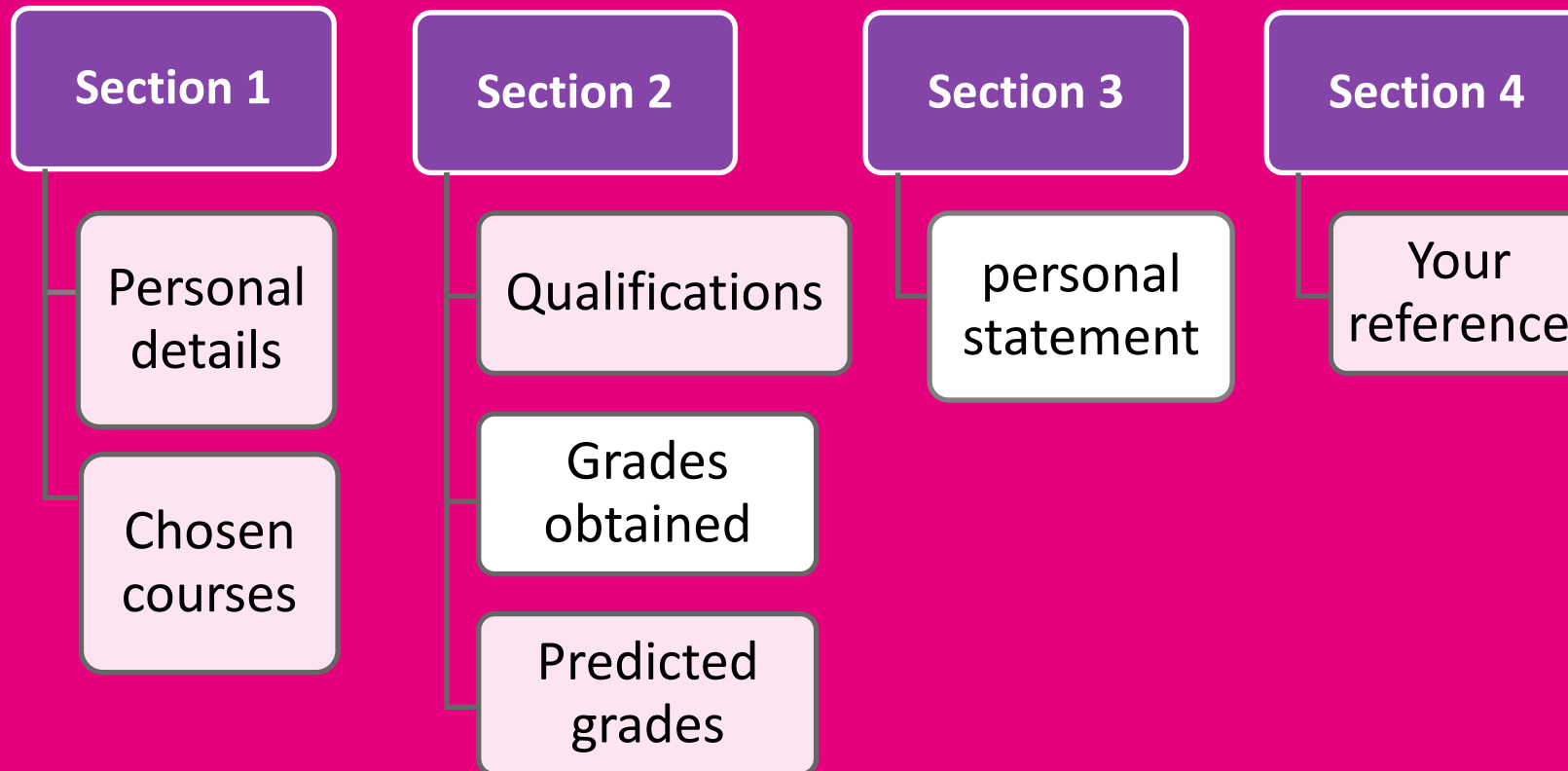
→ apply through UCAS

Foundations and postgraduate courses

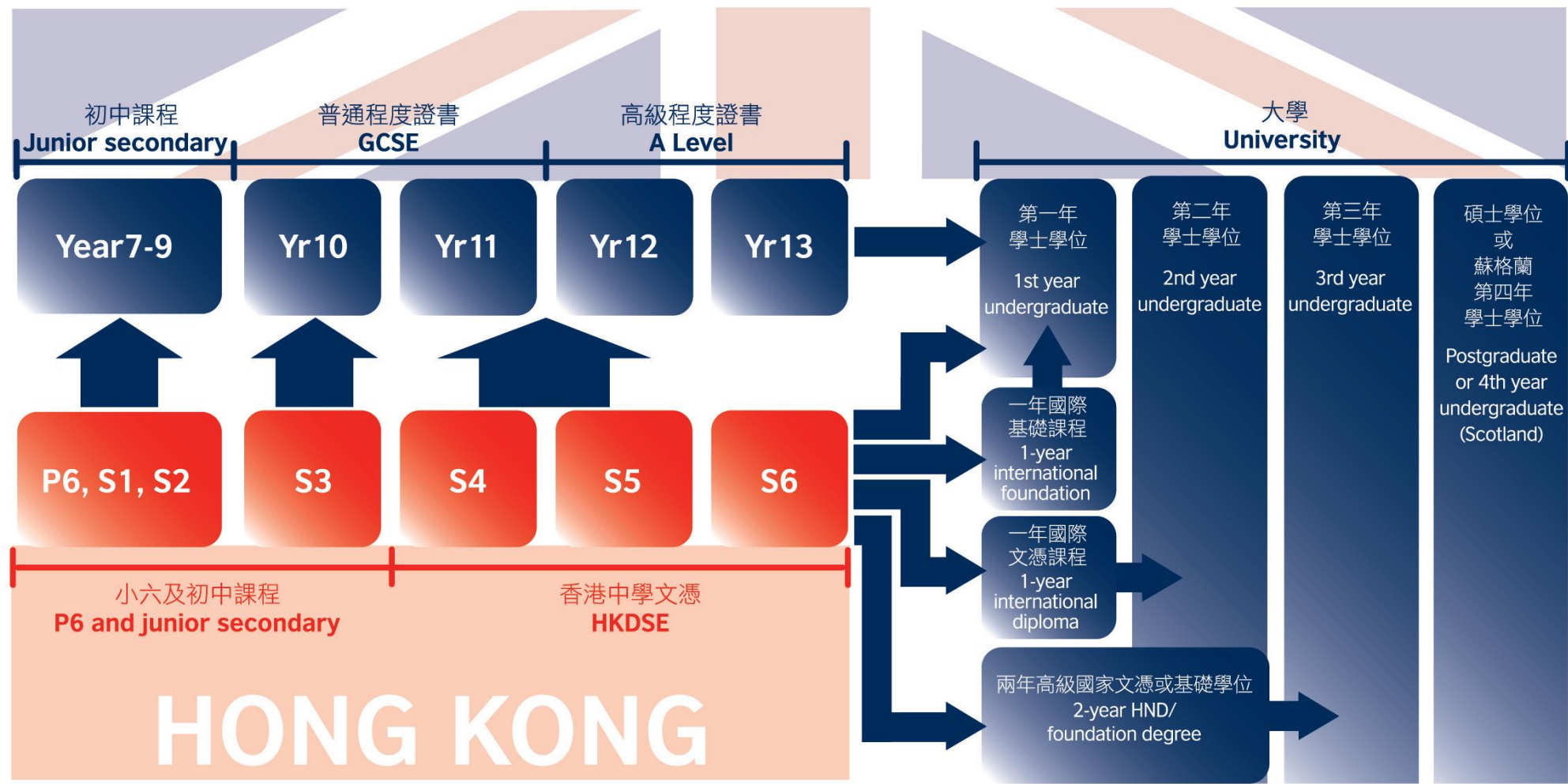
→ apply directly to colleges or universities (and check with institution!)

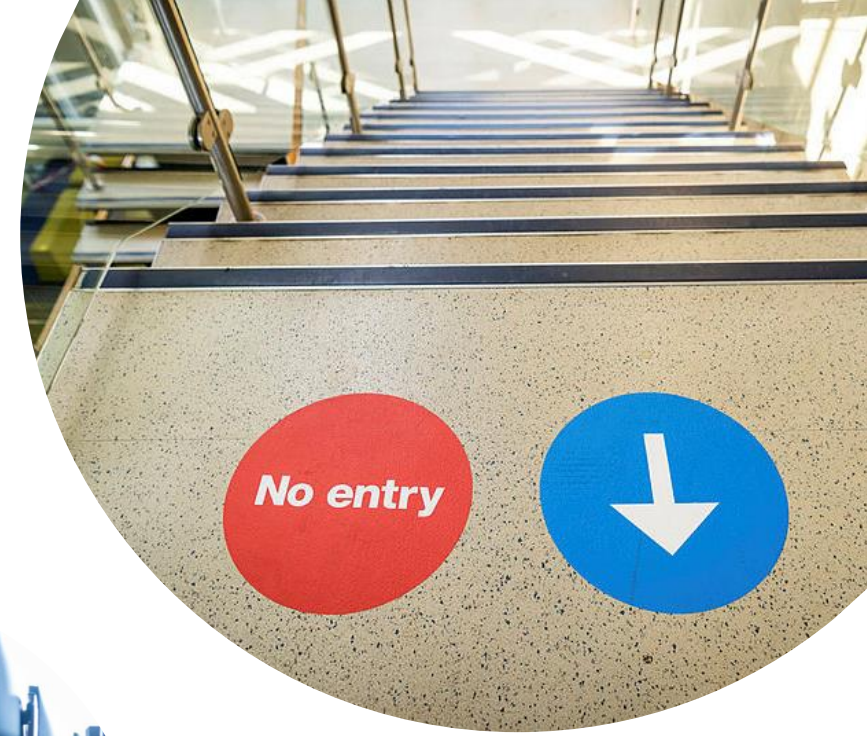

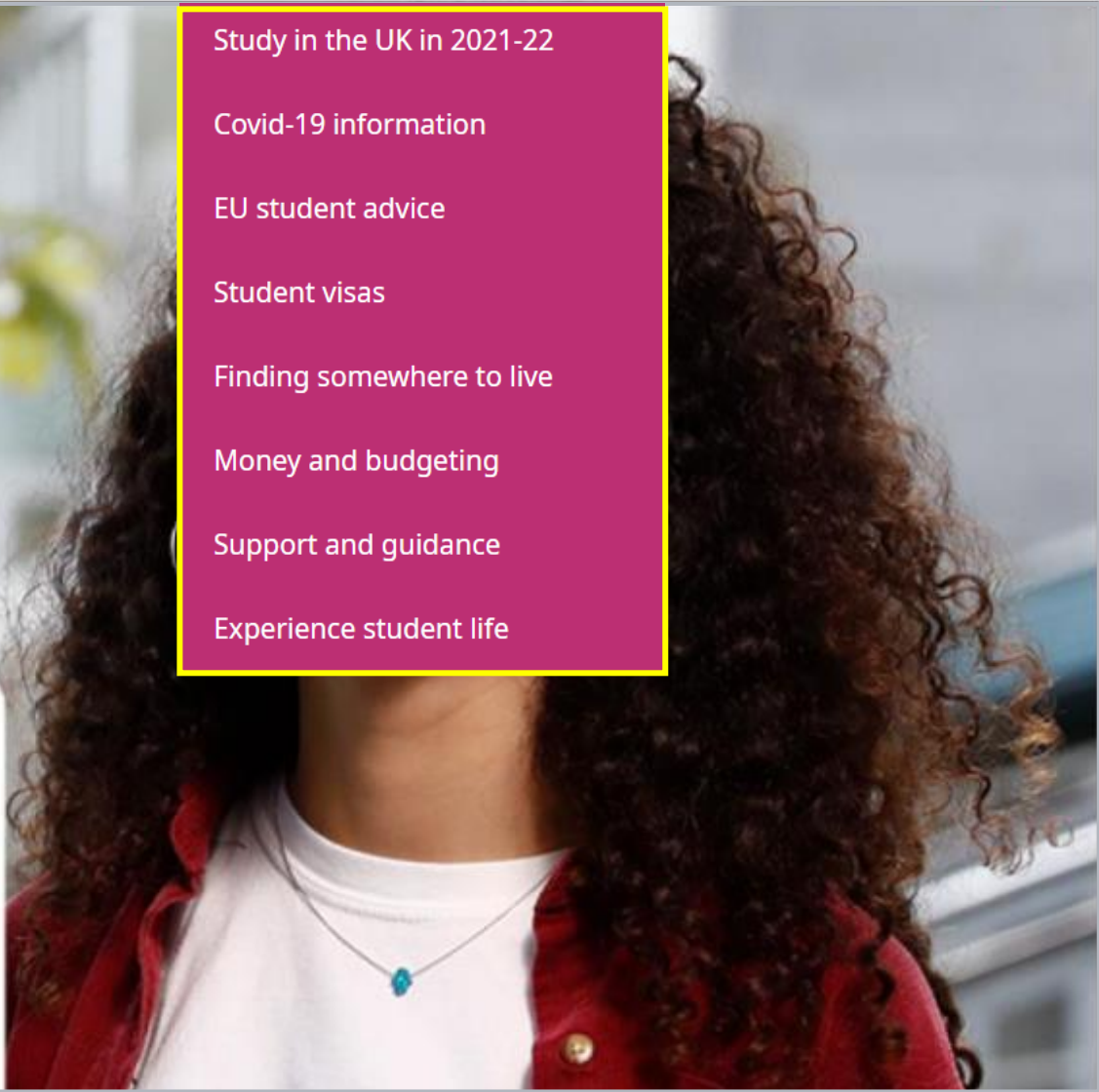
